MATERIALS AND PREPARATION

This activity will require some blackline masters, as well as questions sheets to help guide the students. Each student should have a copy of the "boat" and the questions.

ACTIVITY: BUILD A BOAT FOR YOUR CAREER JOURNEY

TEACHER NOTES (ELABORATIONS)

The *Build a Boat* activity is a career scavenger hunt. Students will create a boat to help them navigate their career options. This activity can be done as a whole group or in small groups. In either case, the students will identify the planks and build their boat using them. All the other elements—who will be on the tiller, what the sails are made from—students will need to find out for themselves.

GUIDING QUESTIONS FOR THE STUDENTS

Explore options in the occupation you have chosen.

- What transferable skills do I have? What transferable skills will my program give me?
- Are there entrepreneurial opportunities in this occupation?
 - Do I need additional skills or do I need to investigate other occupations to make my venture successful?
- What other skills do I need to be able to make my job a reality?
 - Are there additional industry requirements/regulations?
 - Are there additional skills that I need to be successful?
- What other options are available to me with the post-secondary path I have chosen?
 - Does my program give me a foundation for another occupation?
 - Are there specializations in my field?

- The occupations I need to engage with are the sails that help my boat move forward.
- I have oars so that I can choose to power my boat in the direction it needs to go.
- The rudder represents the other options my chosen career field may offer me.
- I can choose to guide my boat, or I can be driven by it.
